

About Wildwood Summer Theatre

Wildwood Summer Theatre was founded in 1965 by a group of students from Walter Johnson High School in Bethesda, Maryland. These theatrically-minded students wanted to extend their high school musical experience into the summer, however they were unable to find an adult sponsor, so they decided to strike out on their own. That summer, on a shoestring budget and with little in the way of material supplies or support, they put on a production of *Bye*, *Bye Birdie*. The show was a rousing success and WST was born. During the past 48 seasons WST has presented at least one, and in two instances, two full-scale musical theater productions each summer.

WST is the only fully independent youth-run summer theatre in the Washington, DC area. Everyone—from the technicians, orchestra and chorus members, to the Director, Producer and Board of Directors—is between 14 and 25 years of age. This dynamic gives youth the rare opportunity to participate in all aspects of the production, including management, design, performance and technical crafts. The company allows young people to experience facets of theatre production not normally open to them. WST prides itself on being a learning theatre; each generation teaches the next.

Director's Note

"If you bring forth what is within you, what you bring forth will save you. If you do not bring forth what is within you, what you do not bring forth will destroy you." – Gospel of Thomas

This quote encapsulates, in my opinion, the spirit of *RENT*, a story of artists and revolutionaries holding out on an ideal in what is fated to be the death of bohemia in Greenwich Village. *RENT* is focused on the power that art wields in our lives. Art heals, and that property is what carries these characters onstage through the trials and tragedies that accompany poverty, addiction, and the ever-present shadow of AIDS. The disease often feels as though it is not the problem of our younger generation, but we as a cast are dedicated to bringing forth the feelings of fear and uncertainty, of grief, and of appreciation for this life that we all cherish; the flurry of emotions that we as a country suffered through and suffer still.

In a way, *RENT* is something a long time coming for WST. It was always my thought throughout my time here that this show embodies much of the rebellious spirit on which this company was founded upon 50 years ago. Starting as a group of kids that wanted to make their own art, independently and regardless of what any authority had to say about whether or not they could. I know that it resonates with me in my youthful fury, but the spirit of this company has apparently resonated with our audiences as well, as we find ourselves here, seated over 50 years after that fateful performance of *Bye*, *Bye*, *Birdie* that would kick-start half a century's worth of heritage and tradition. The two shows, of then and now, are really quite similar when you think about it. Rock 'n Roll has a lot to do with it.

Regardless, thank you for your patronage and support through the years, and for being this theatre company's community. Without you, we could not be celebrating today. Thank you.






